MONTHLY REPORT FOR SEPTEMBER, 2007

Introduction

The Directorate of Investigations and Asset Tracing is one of the four Directorates of the Kenya Anti-Corruption Commission. The Directorate is charged with the responsibility of investigating Corruption and Economic Crimes and other offences stipulated under the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act (2003).


The Directorate is further mandated to investigate the extent of liability for the loss of or damage to any public property for purposes of recovery or compensation. This is besides investigating and tracing the whereabouts of corruptly acquired assets for purposes of recovery.

In addition, the Directorate is also mandated to assist any law enforcement agency in the country in the investigation of corruption or economic crimes.

The Directorate comprises four Departments namely:

- i. Reports and Data Centre,
- ii. Forensic Investigations (FI),
- iii. Special Operations (SO) and
- iv. Intelligence Production

Mombasa Office

The Mombasa Regional Office currently under the Directorate of Investigations and Asset began operations on 4th June 2007. All the four departments of the Directorate namely Reports and Data Centre, Forensic Investigations (FI), Special Operations (SO) and Intelligence Production are represented and have began operations. The office is yet to be officially launched.

REPORTS AND DATA CENTRE - NAIROBI


During the month of **September 2007**, the Reports and Data Department has processed a total of **487** (new) reports. After analysis and classification, **109** reports disclosed (possible) offences within the mandate of the Commission and were dealt with as follows: **30** cases were forwarded to the Special Operations Department for immediate action, **74** called for preliminary investigations and were consequently forwarded to the Intelligence Production Department, **2** cases were forwarded to the Forensics Department, **2** cases were forwarded to Legal Services and **1** other case was forwarded to Senior management.


The remaining **378** cases were found to be outside the Commission's mandate and were disposed of as follows:

- i. **33** cases were forwarded to other investigative agencies for action- with the Criminal Investigations Department accounting for **13**, Police **7**, KRA **12** and the Immigration Department **1**.
- ii. **66** cases to various public service organisations for administrative intervention,
- iii. in 94 cases the complainants were advised to seek civil redress,
- iv. in 175 cases the complainants were advised on the right authority to report to,
- v. **6** after analysis were recommended for No Further Action, and
- vi. in **4** of the cases the complainants were requested to avail more details.

In the same period a total of 182 clients/informants visited the Department to lodge reports and /or seek advice. Of this number, 149 were visiting the Commission for the first time, while the remaining 33 were following up on their cases.

Categorization of reports Processed by KACC in September 2007












The Forensics Department in Mombasa received **5** reports in total. 3 of the reports came from the Reports Centre in Nairobi.



INTELLIGENCE PRODUCTION – MOMBASA

Introduction

During the month under review, the Intelligence Team maintained focus on key revenue collection areas at the Kilindini Port and the Old Port.

As a result, several containers which were suspected to be either under declared/and or misdeclared at both the One Stop Centre and the Scan Centre were seized awaiting verification by a joint team of KRA and KACC and further necessary action by the Forensics Team. This focus also led to team learning that a consignment of assorted goods that was seized by a joint KACC/KRA team on 28th August 2007 following information from the Intelligence Team was irregularly released from a KPA go down before any verification of the contents was done thereby sabotaging investigations.
