

PRESS STATEMENT BY THE ETHICS AND ANTI-CORRUPTION COMMISSION ON THE STATUTORY REPORTS FORWARDED TO THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC PROSECUTIONS

- 1. The Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC) is a constitutional Commission mandated to combat and prevent corruption and economic crime in Kenya through law enforcement, preventive measure and public education.
- 2. The Commission has the best investigators and engages specialists in professions such as procurement, surveyors, forensic analysts among others. Regionally the Commission was ranked number one (1) on evidence and management of exhibits among 17 commonwealth Africa-Anticorruption Centre (CAACC) and the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC)
- 3. The Commission has a close working relationship with the Office of the Director of Public Prosecutions (ODPP) including the former DPP, Keriako Tobiko. In 2016/2017, **25** cases were finalized in court resulting in **18** convictions and **7** acquittals (Conviction rate of 72%).

In 2017/2018 **44** cases have been finalized by the courts resulting in **35** convictions and **9** acquittals (conviction rate of 79%).
