Introduction


The Directorate of Investigation and Asset Tracing is one of the four Directorates of the Kenya Anti-Corruption Commission. The functions of the Directorate include:

- Investigate Corruption and Economic Crimes as stipulated in the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act (2003).
- Investigate the extent of liability, loss or damage to any public property for purposes of recovery or compensation,
- Investigate and trace the whereabouts of corruptly acquired assets for purposes of recovery.
- Assist any law enforcement agency in the country in investigation of corruption or economic crimes.

Effective January 2008, the Directorate has been reorganised into three departments, namely; Operations, Forensics and Intelligence.

- i. Operations- comprising two divisions; Report Centre and Rapid Response,
- ii. Forensics- comprising two divisions; Forensic Investigation and Asset Tracing,
- iii. Intelligence- comprising three divisions: Analysis & Production, Preliminary Investigation and Collection

Structure of the Directorate



Mombasa Office

The Mombasa Regional Office which is under the Directorate of Investigation and Asset Tracing commenced operations on 4th June 2007 and was officially launched on 4th December 2007. All the three departments of the Directorate, namely; Forensic Investigation (FI), Operations and Intelligence Production are represented.

Report Centre - Nairobi

During the month of **January 2008**, the Reports Centre Division processed **207** (new) reports. The number of reports received and processed dropped by **16** when compared to the month of **December 2007** when a total of **223** new cases were handled in the division. The drop in figures is mainly attributed to post election violence currently affecting the country.


After analysis and classification the reports were disposed off follows:

- The Commission took up for investigation **53 reports** found to be within our mandate. The Intelligence Production Department accounted for **37** of the cases. Among the **37** were **4** reports which contained additional information on cases already under investigation. The Rapid Response Division took up **9** cases for investigation, while **3** were forwarded to the Legal Services Directorate for action. Another **3** reports which contained information relating to last year's General Election were forwarded to the Election Monitoring Team to consolidate its report, while Forensic Investigation Department took up the remaining **1** case.
- Other investigative agencies accounted for 11 cases. The Criminal Investigations Department took up 4 four of the cases under this category, while, the Kenya Revenue Authority and the Directorate of Immigration Services took 2 and 5 cases respectively.
- In a majority of the cases the complainants/informer were advised on the right authority to seek intervention. **88** of the total cases received fell under this category.
- Another 22 cases were forwarded to other public service organisations for action, while in 6 the complainants/informers were requested to avail more details.
- The remaining 27 cases did not require the Commission's intervention and were therefore marked as No Further Action cases.



Comparative Analysis Showing the Cases received for the past 6 months.












