Honesty is the act of being frank and sincere. An honest person tells the truth, does not cheat and stands for what is right.


Characteristics of an honest person

- 8. Is straightforward


Reasons for being honest

- 3. Is approachable and accessible




Reasons for helping

- 5. Makes one highly productive




Characteristics of an orderly person
